Bargaining Summary – Day 3

We met with the employer today, highlights include:

- While Children's continues their lack of movement on our vacation proposal, we have made winning movement on the floor. Congrats to 6th floor Minneapolis nurses who stepped up and joined together to show their dissatisfaction with Children's unilateral change to no vacation slots per shift for the summer. They pushed Children's back to have at least one nurse per shift to have vacation. This is proof that we need contract language to guarantee vacation to nurses and we can get there by standing together to raise the standard. Make sure to show up to Tuesday's All Member Meeting to complete a vacation postcard to show your support!
- We have been waiting to receive contract language from Children's since day one. We arrived ready to bargain and waited until nearly 11 a.m. for just their proposal language. Management didn't have any counter-proposals for us AGAIN. We are willing to bargain, but we won't bargain against ourselves.
- As a negotiation team we stood up and made statements calling out Children's disrespect at the table. We don't always agree with the hospital, but we usually have a respectful relationship. Children's is getting bad legal advice from their attorney, who seems to think that condescension is appropriate for the bargaining table.
- It took us standing up to get any continued discussion from Children's on flex time, mandatory low need, workplace violence and the remainder of our non-economic proposals.
- During our discussion of flex time, Children's explained that any unused flex time, if a cap were in place, could be donated to the Foundation because that's the option non-contract employees currently have.
