

MNA NURSES RAISING STANDARDS TOGETHER

Summary



Bargaining day three started with four courageous MNA Fairview nurses coming to share their moving stories of workplace violence with management. Their stories touched on their lack of training to deal with dangerous situations, no consistency in the debrief process and the financial hardships nurses face when injured on the job. These nurses gave detailed accounts of their assaults and the ongoing personal impact of their experiences.

Nurses Ask	Management Response: "Not Interested" in contract change
Workplace Violence Prevention Training for nurses on all units	"We want to make sure the contract is not going to limit our ability to respond"
Scheduling Mandatory Education	"not interested" "it is the nurses' responsibility"
Break Nurse available for all units	"if nurses can't figure out the best time to take a break, charge could get involved" "as last resort management can make individualized plan"
Improve Grid Review Process	"our process is not broken; we think it works well"

Once again, management stressed the need for collaboration on addressing workplace violence prevention but did nothing to offer concrete actions to keep nurses safe at work. They insisted that they had done "tremendous amount on workplace violence" and continued to focus on enhancing an existing committee.
