	We thank the authors and advocates who have supported S.F. 26, legislation that will restore the right to vote for Minnesotans who completed their penal sentences and are seeking to fully reenter their communities. We believe that our criminal justice system should not only be about justice, but also about rehabilitation and that denying Minnesotans the right to vote after they have already served their sentence is itself a great injustice.
	Greater involvement in civic life, including practicing one's right to vote, leads to stronger ties in one's own community. Justice-involved Minnesotans deserve the opportunity to fully participate in civic life, and to make this a reality, the Legislature should remove antiquated laws that were originally established with the purpose of disenfranchising members of our communities and barring them from participating in elections.
